- Hire and evaluate the superintendent your only employee!
- Set and approve the district budget
- Adopt and review curriculum
- Develop and adopt policies to govern



Be Prepared

- Read all material BEFORE the meeting
- Jot notes to things that you don't understand
- Ask questions to Board President or Superintendent
- Listen, Listen, Listen





Be Prepared

- Learn how the meeting works
- Meet with your board President and superintendent prior to first meeting
- Study Robert's Rules of Order (suggested www.jurassicparliment. com)





Know Your Policy



- Review your policy manual
- Ask questions
- Get familiar with the process of updating your policies



You and the Superintendent

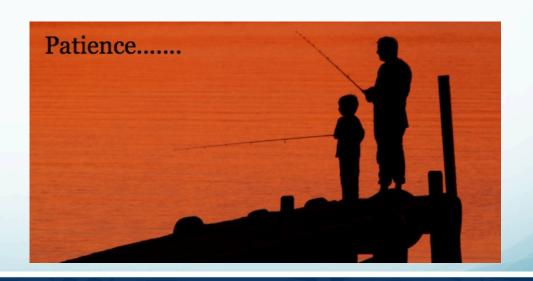
- Work on mutual respect and trust

 spent on this topic





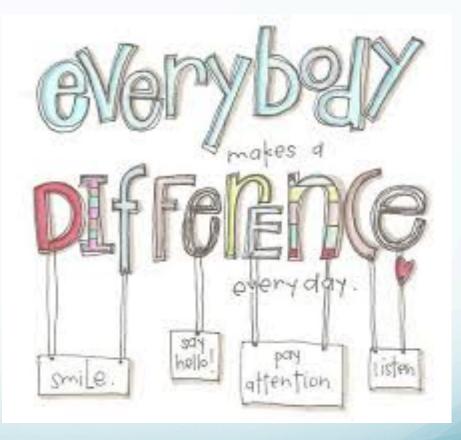
Listen

Effective Governance Through Board Standards-Alaska Style

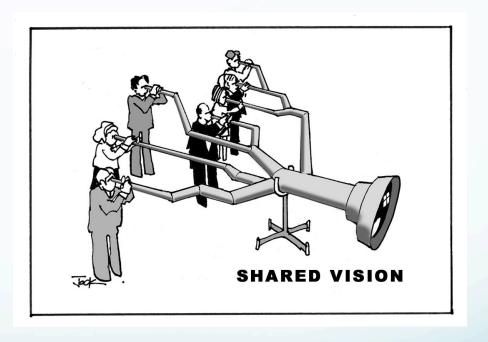


- Vision

Vision: Unusual capability in discernment or perception; a mental image created by the imagination.

The board creates a shared vision to enhance student achievement





Structure: The manner in which parts are arranged or combined to form a whole; interrelation of parts in a complex entity.

The board provides a structure that supports the vision.



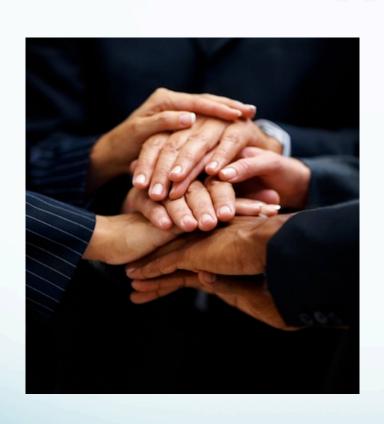
Accountability: capable of being explained; answerable.

The board measures district performance toward accomplishing the vision and reports the results to the public
