Travel:

Since we know you will be flying in (no roads in remember) search for Juneau International Airport when booking. Both Alaska Airlines and Delta fly into Juneau. All flights will either come in from Seattle or Anchorage. It is a 2-hour flight from Seattle and 1.5 hours from Anchorage.

We have arranged for a 5% discount for Alaska Air flights for the conference. This includes travel to and from the lower 48 and within Alaska between Anchorage and Juneau. Inclusive dates are June 13th to 27th. When booking with Alaska Air, use this fare discount code: **ECMZ360**

Other side trips to add to your experience include:

- Tracy Arm Cruise; full day event to a stunning calving glacier, there will also be baby seals as they birth up the 'arm' so the whales can not kill/eat the babies. https://www.adventureboundalaska.com/
- Mount Roberts Tram; right in downtown Juneau this allows you time to get to 1500 feet without the hiking ©. There is a lot of exploring once you are atop the mountain. http://mountrobertstramway.com/
