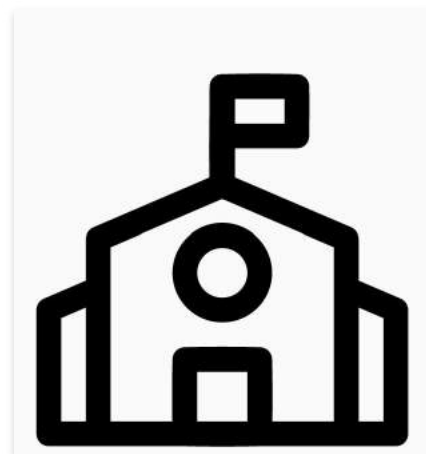

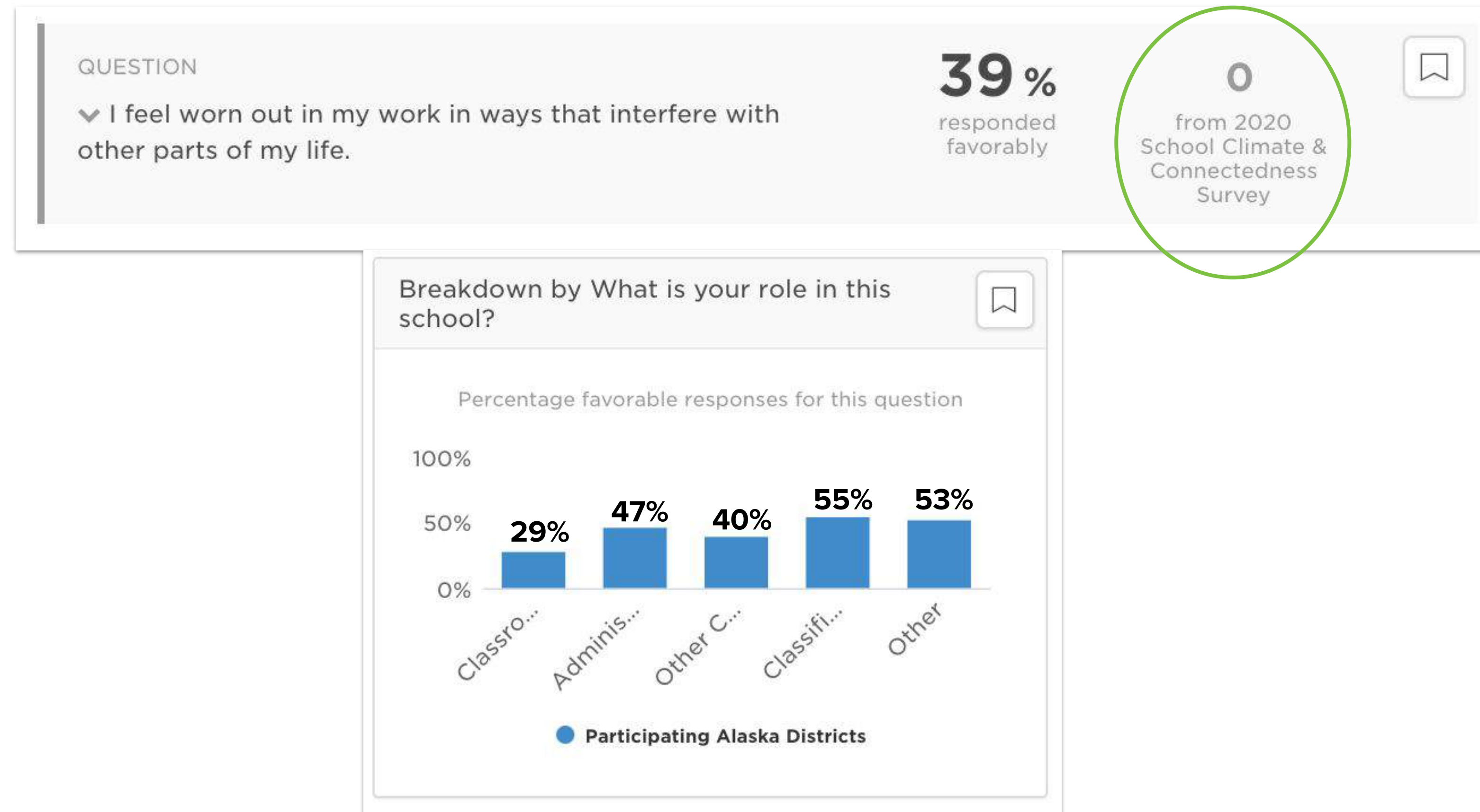

Insight #2: [Topic: Trauma Engaged Schools] More than 2 out of every 3 staff members report feeling worn out at work.

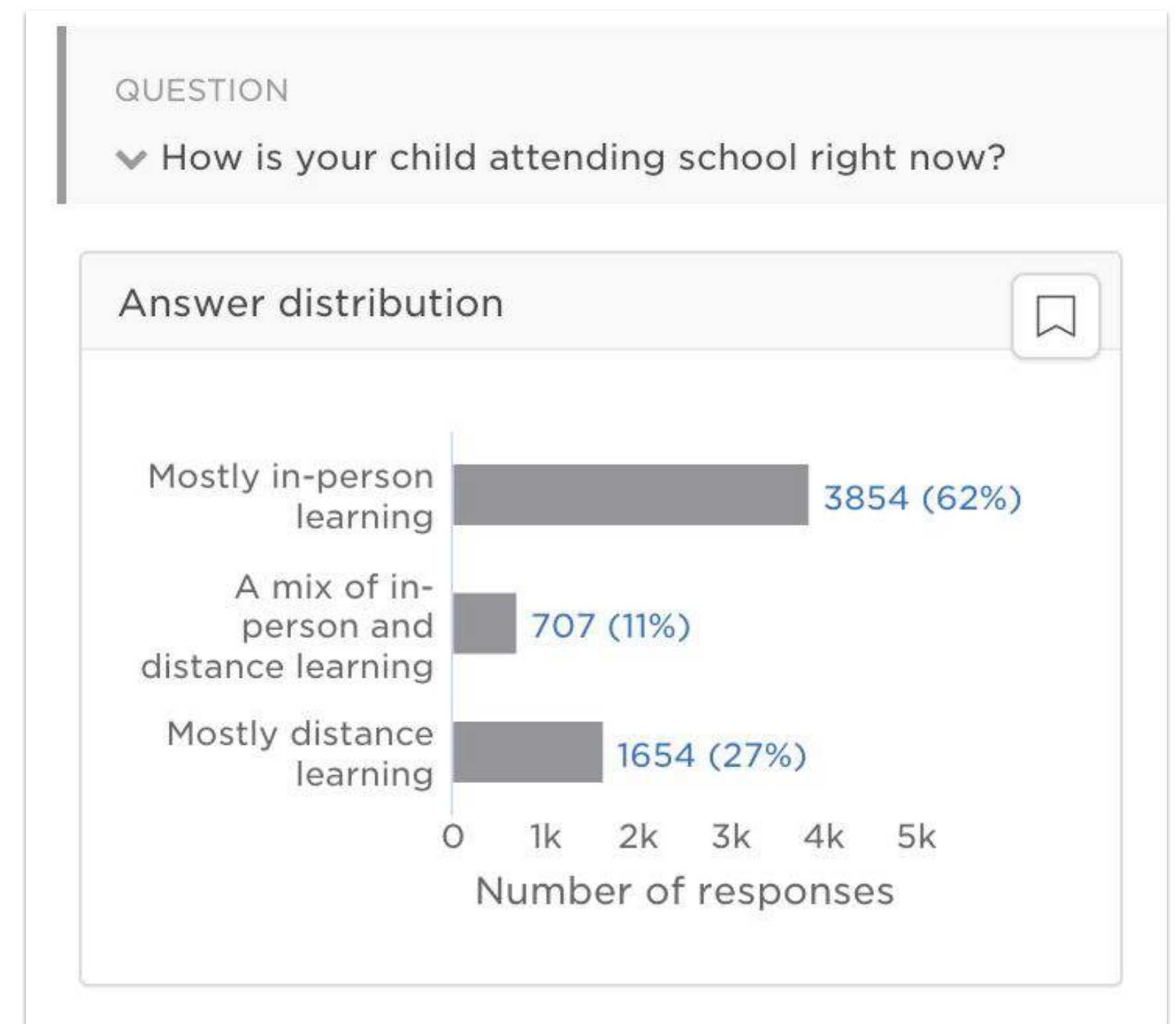

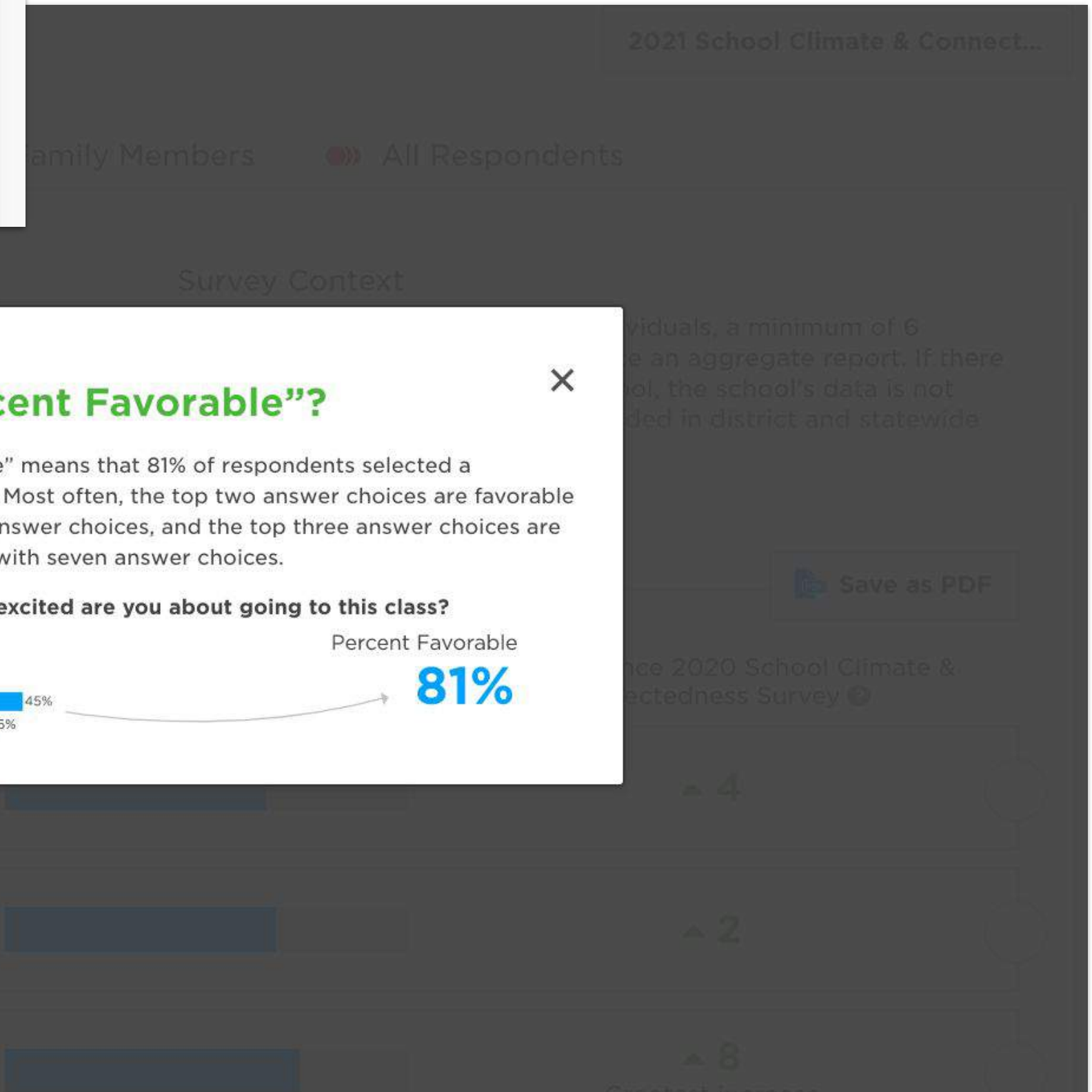
What is "Percent Favorable"?

A score of "81% favorable" means that 81% of respondents selected a favorable answer choice. Most often, the top two answer choices are favorable for a question with five answer choices, and the top three answer choices are favorable for a question with seven answer choices.

Example question: How excited are you about going to this class?

Not at all excited	4%
Slightly excited	6%
Somewhat excited	9%
Quite excited	45%
Very excited	36%

Percent Favorable: **81%**

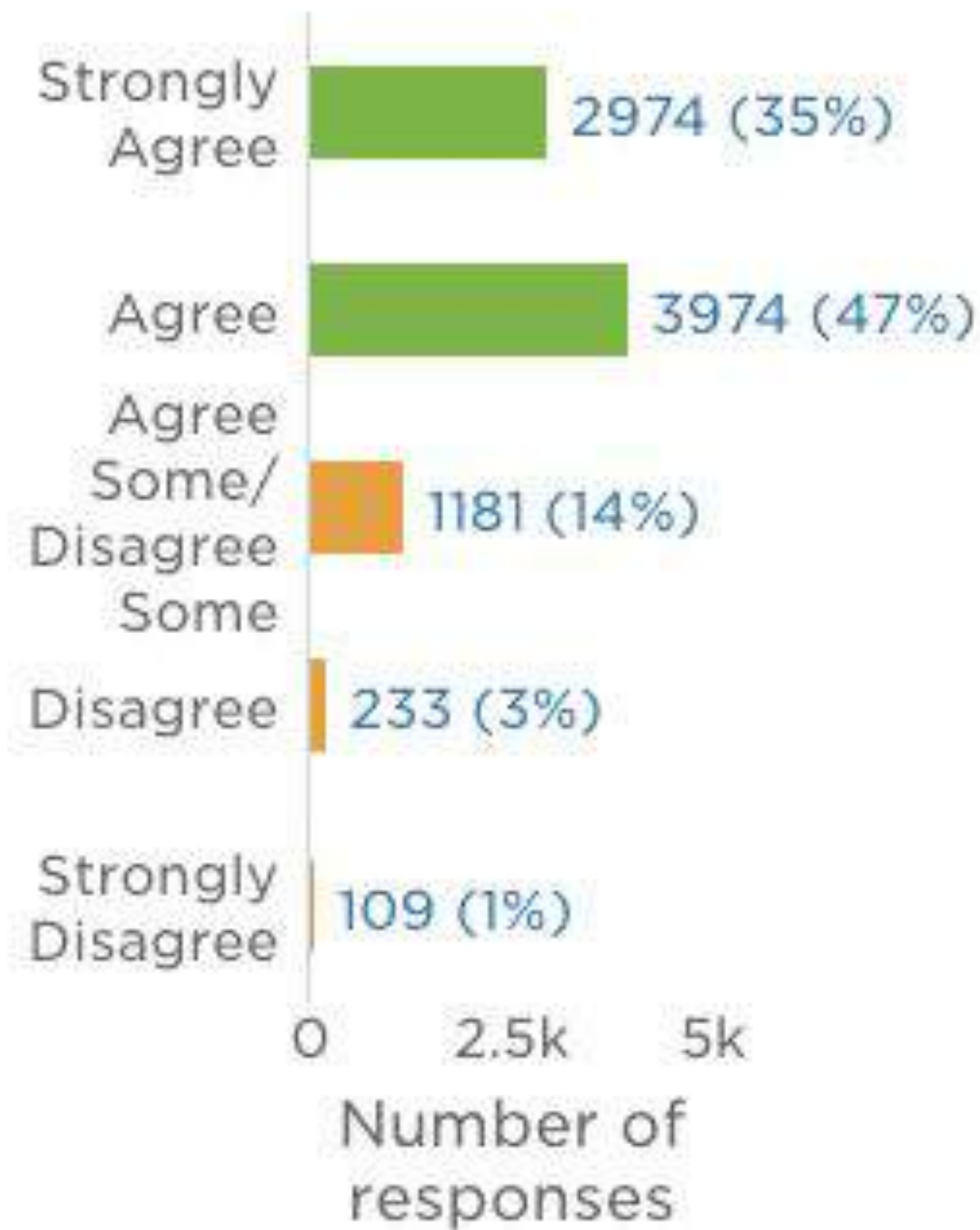

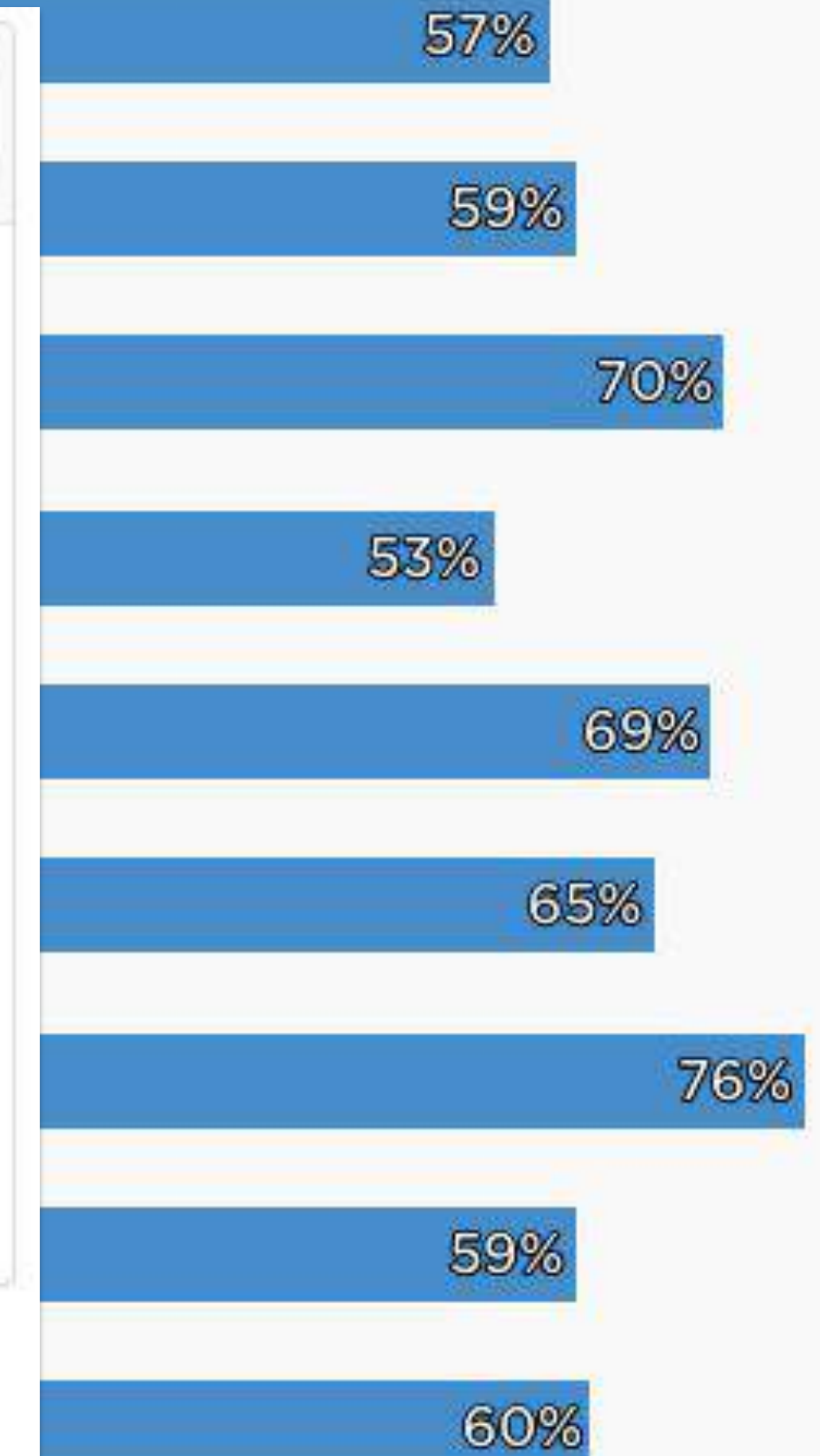

Percentage favorable responses for this question

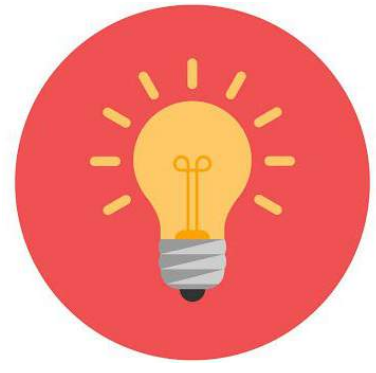

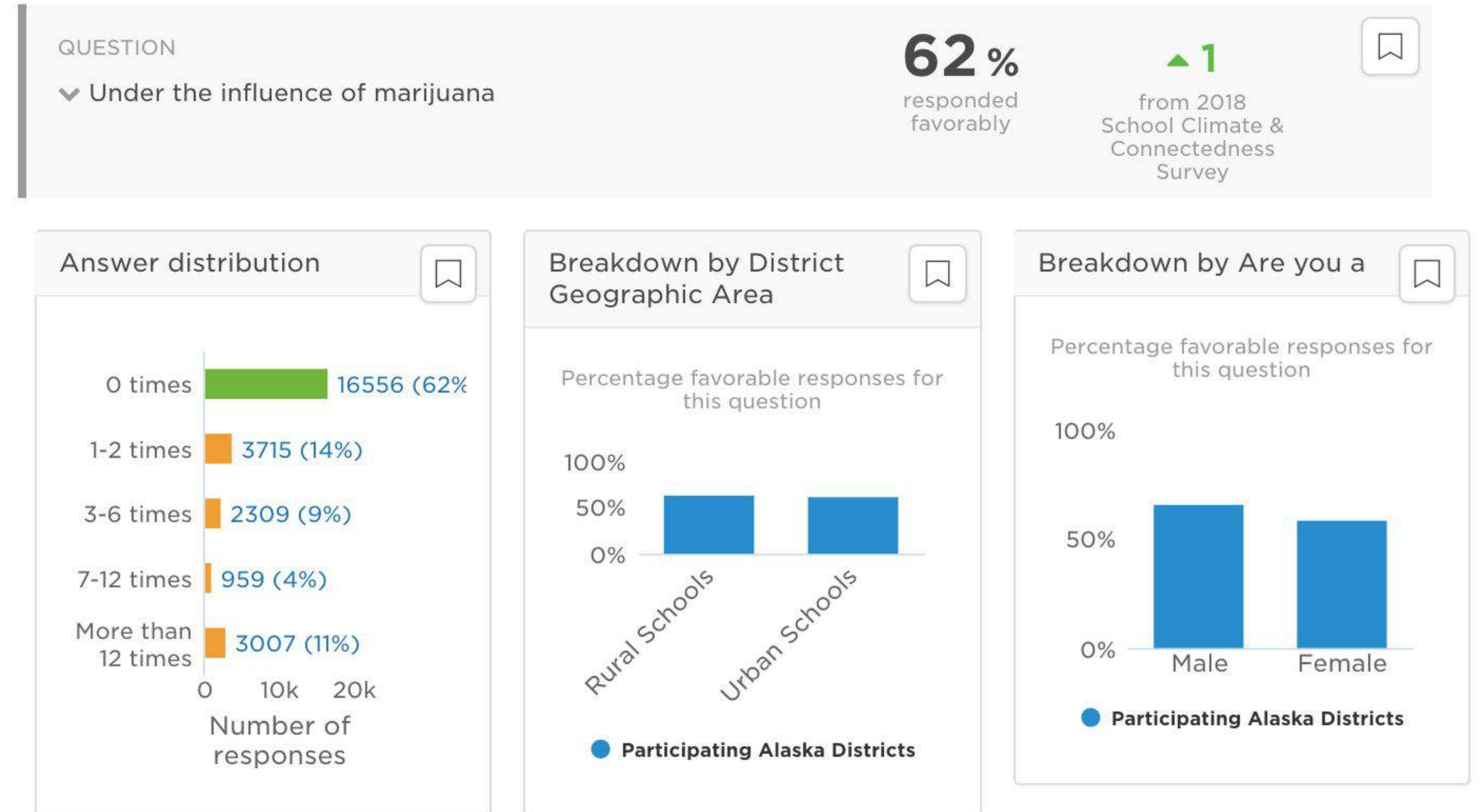
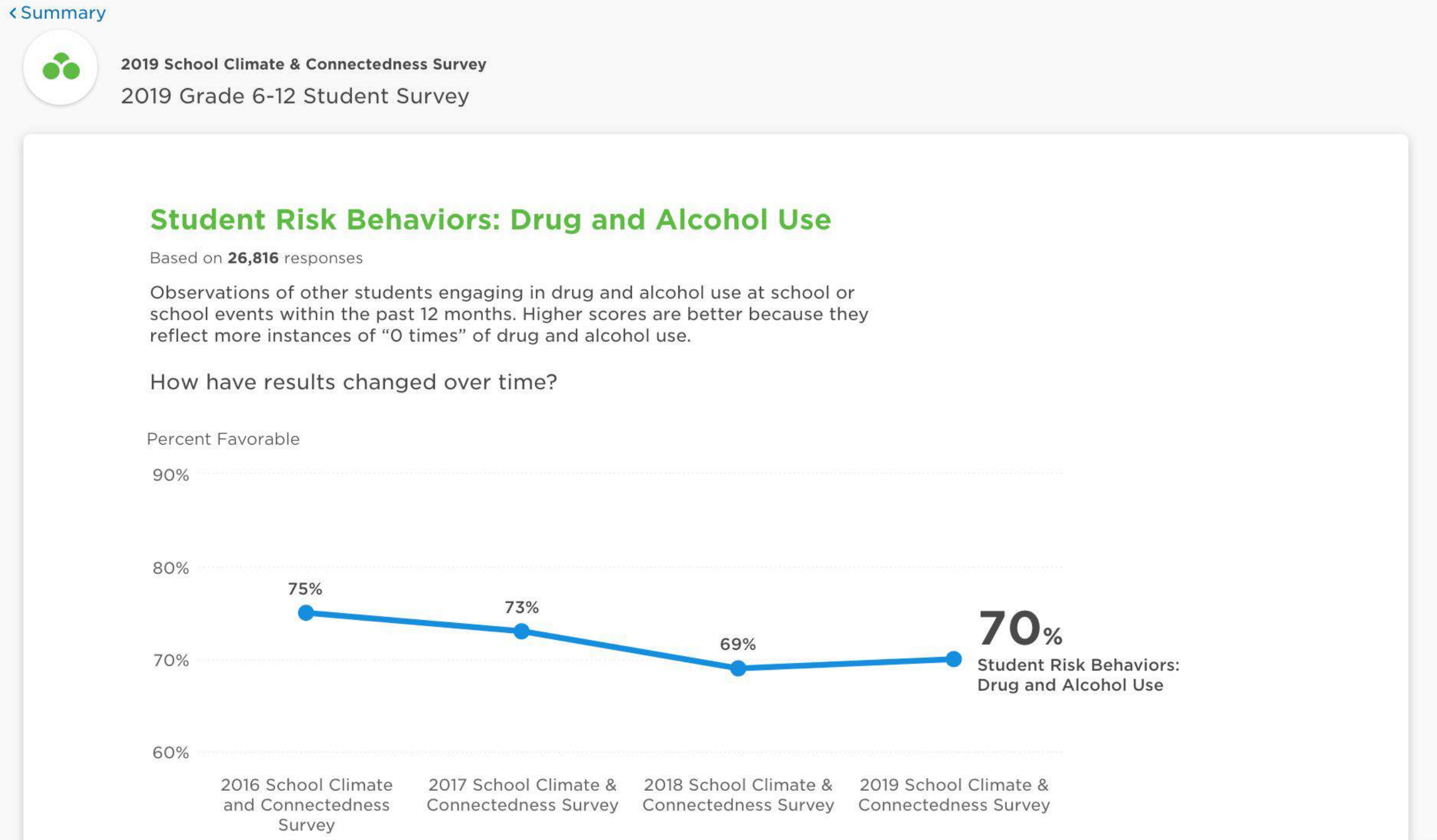

Q: What does the scoring mean on "negatively" scored items?




Higher scores are "better" because they reflect fewer instances of risk behaviors = More instances of students responding "0 Times"

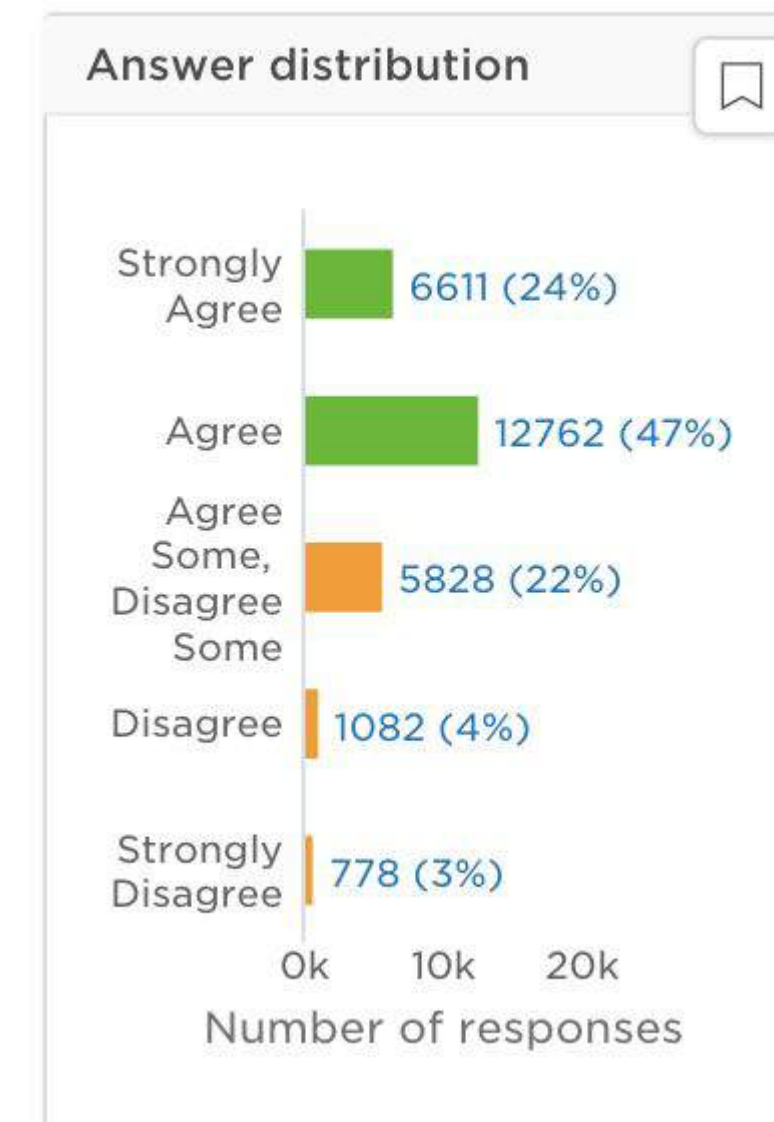
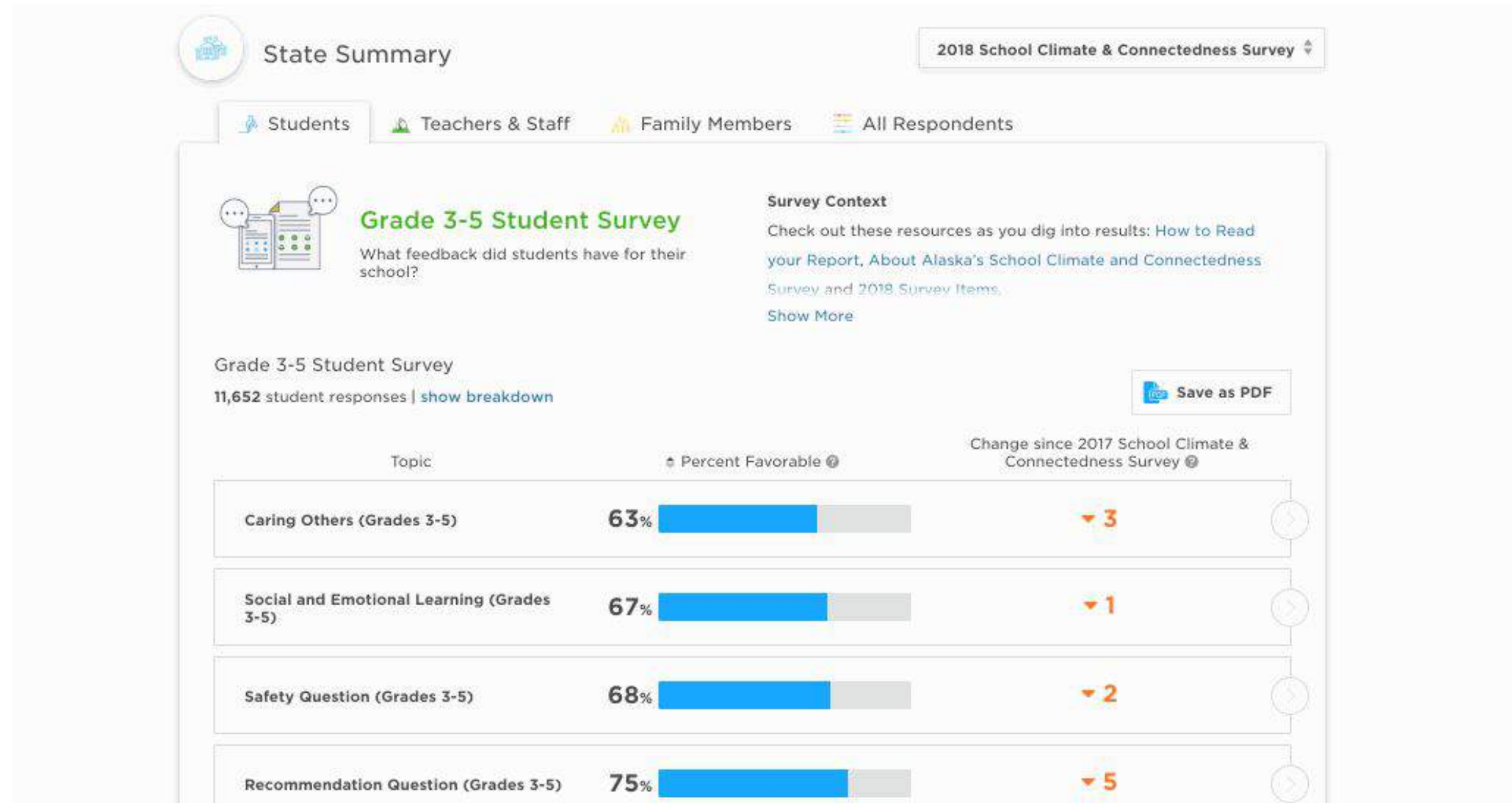

Q: How are the results scored?



Results are scored in “Percent Favorable”. When a question is scored as “75% favorable,” this means that 75% of respondents selected a **favorable answer choice**. Most often, the top two answer choices are favorable for a question with five answer choices, and the top one answer choice is favorable for a question with three answer choices.

Using Your Results to Make Data-Informed Decisions



Recommended Next Steps

1. **Send out results**: Email public survey link to staff, school board, district leaders
(*Other staff can have a Panorama account to have bookmarks, etc.*)
2. **Identify your team**: Who will dig into results with you? Who will help to create action steps?

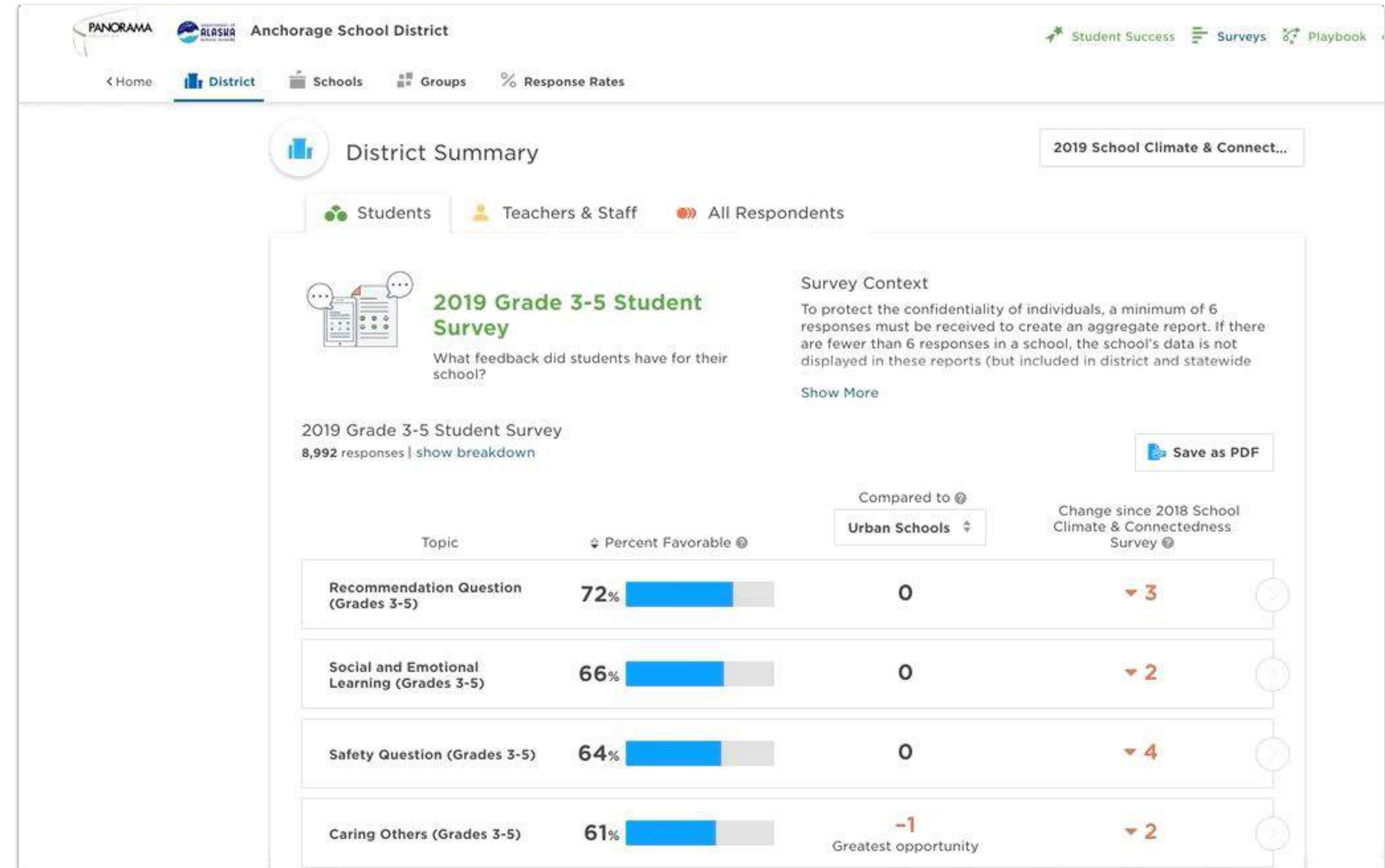

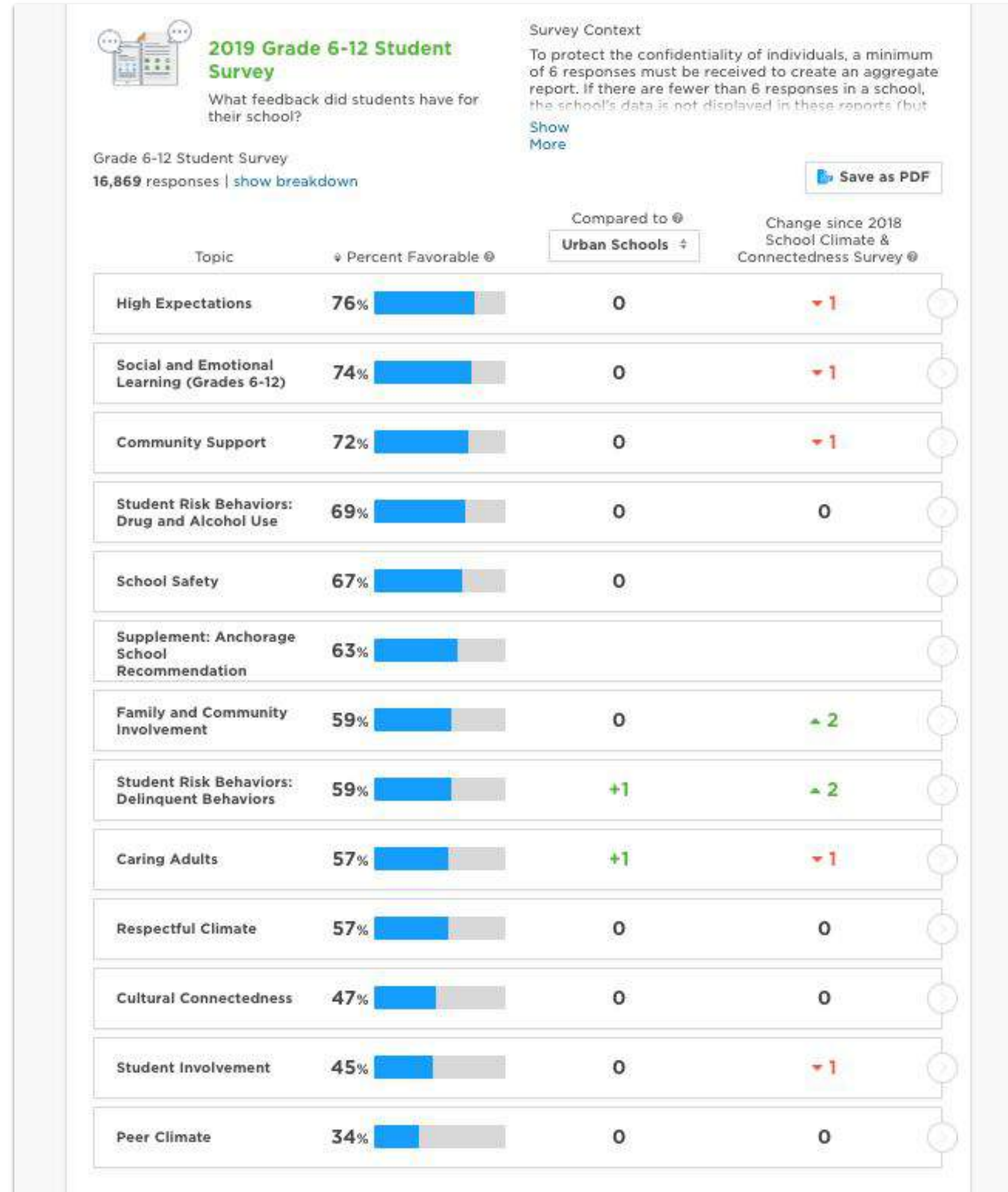

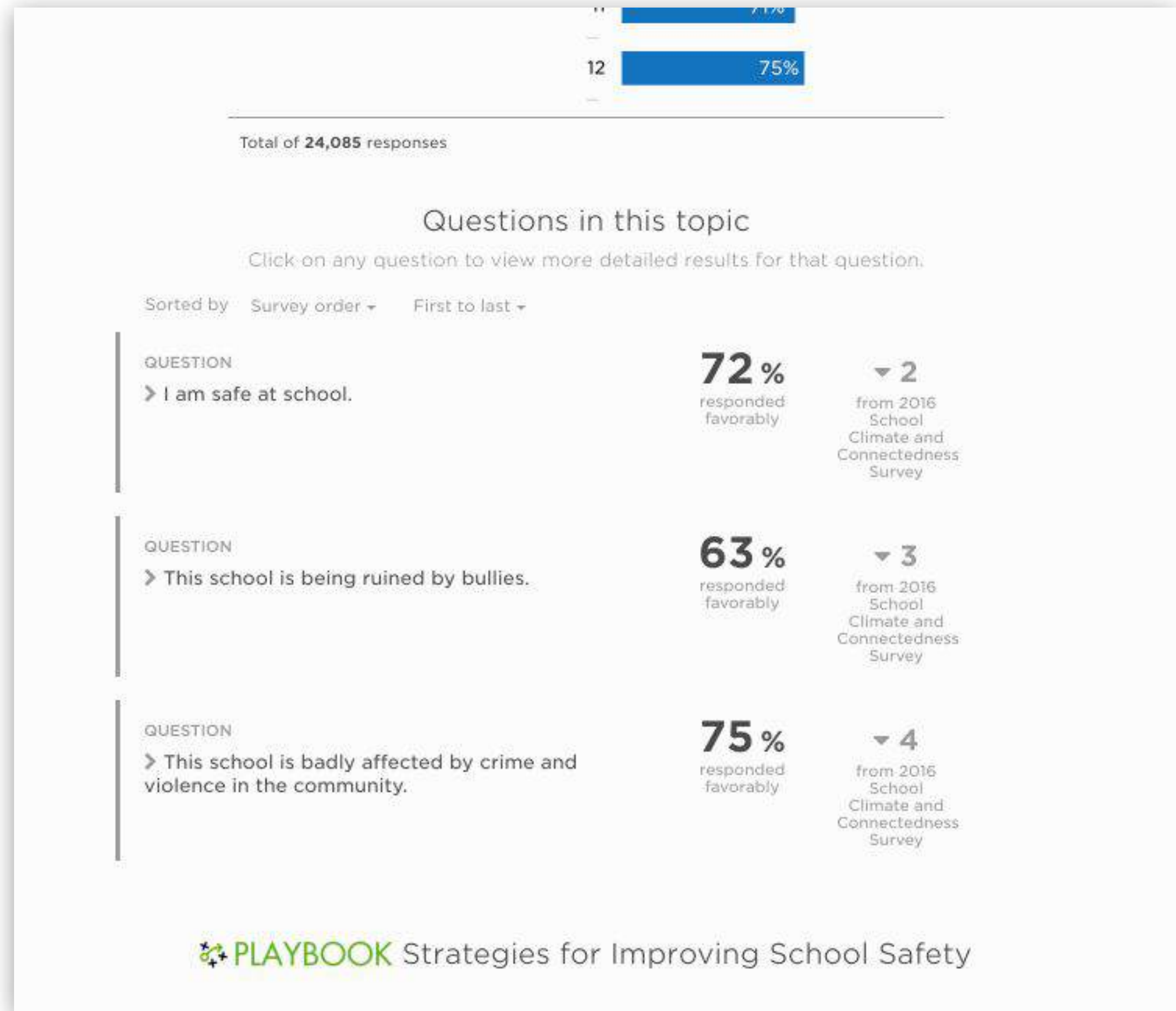
