BB 9311 SCHOOL BOARD POLICIES

Note: Pursuant to A.S. 14.14.100, policies relating to the management and control of the district must be expressed in written bylaws formally adopted at regular board meetings. The following sample bylaw may be revised to

reflect district philosophy and needs.



Receives and acts on policy recommendations of the Superintendent!



Seek Input on District Policies

BB 9310 POLICY MANUAL (mid policy)

The School Board welcomes suggestions from the public regarding its adopted policies and regulations.



Encourages members of the community to contribute information and opinions for the School Board's consideration and propose revisions to policy



Establishes procedures to be used when adopting policy

BB 9311 (mid policy)

The adoption of policy shall conform with School Board bylaws governing agenda, meetings, and voting. Only those written statements adopted and recorded in the minutes shall constitute official School Board policy

Prior to adoption, policies shall normally be given two readings by the School Board. At its second reading, the policy may be adopted by a majority vote of all members of the School Board. The School Board may waive the second reading or may require additional readings.



The Policy Manual is a living document

The Board should continuously review policy.





Communicate the Districts Policies

BB 9310 POLICY MANUAL

In governing the district, the School Board has pledged to consider the will and needs of the community. The district's policy manual is developed, <u>distributed and maintained</u> for the purpose of communicating to interested parties the policies, regulations and bylaws within which our schools will operate.

Administrative Regulations vs Policies

Policies	AR's
Required Board Approval	Does NOT require board approval
	The Board can ask the Superintendent to revisit an AR if they feel the intent of the policy is not being honored
Sets the "What" the board wants	Gets into the "How" it will happen
Part of the policy manual	Also part of the policy manual
