DEC Mission


To conserve, improve, and protect Alaska's natural resources and environment and control water, land, and air pollution, in order to enhance the health, safety, and welfare of the people of

- Cruise Ship monitoring



What makes a Class 2 Facility?

- \geq 1,000 and <420,000 gallons total capacity
- Minimum ≥ 1,000 gallon containers
- Aboveground storage tanks
- Onshore
- Noncrude
- Not residential



Examples

- Schools
- Hotels
- Seafood plants
- Community buildings
- Electric co-ops
- Bulk fuel facilities
- Restaurants
- Hospitals







Regulatory Requirements

Class 2 facility regulations

- Registration form
 - Facility info (contact, location)
 - Dates (facility vs tank)
 - Owner(s) and Operator(s)
 - Tank information
 - Completion
- Misc
 - Supplemental forms deadlines
 - Unknowns/comments
 - Exemptions



Why a New Class?

- Fuel & fuel storage is essential
 - Requires constant attention and diligent maintenance and training
- Frequent spills
- No previous DEC regulations
- Create a statewide inventory
- Start a dialogue with stakeholders

Benefits

- Spill reduction
 - Training and assistance
 - \$aves money
 - Healthier communities
- Information hub
 - Special opportunities
 - State advocate



Common Questions & Concerns

- Duplicative effort?
 - SPCCs & FRPs
 - State fire marshal
 - Previous assessments
- Alternative forms of registration
- Increase financial gap





Prevention & Preparedness

- Monthly inspections
 - SCA
 - Test equipment
 - Check for vulnerabilities
- Operator training
 - Facility equipment and operating procedures
 - Safe fuel transfer
 - Spill response
- Update documentation
