This joint publication has been produced by a coalition of public education advocates dedicated to ensuring opportunities for Alaska's children and providing the public with facts about the GREAT work of Alaska's public schools.

In partnership, these advocacy organizations administered a public opinion poll (through Zogby Analytics\*) to better understand Alaska voter perspectives on pre-K, K-12 public education issues. In this initial poll, results show strong support for K-12 and pre-K public education in Alaska.

Each of our organizations is committed to priorities that will move education forward and ensure that every student in Alaska receives a quality public education every day, no matter what it takes.


The Alaska education community has made progress, and we seek to build collective efforts that ensure we fulfill both the State's constitutional responsibility for public education and our vision for our children.

\* Zogby Analytics is a highly respected, international polling and research company using industry-standard methodologies with a margin of error of +/-4.5% **Alaskans have shown overwhelming support for our public school system.** A majority of Alaskans give the schools in their community a passing grade, with over **50**% giving their local schools a grade of "B" or higher. A majority of Alaskans give Alaska's public schools overall a passing grade.


## Alaskans are invested in ensuring the success of students.

DO YOU SUPPORT OR OPPOSE STATE-FUNDED PUBLIC PRE-SCHOOL?













Alaskans believe our public schools should provide a well-rounded education to all children.

## Our Vision for Alaska's Students

Our organizations are committed to priorities that will move education forward and ensure that every student in Alaska receives a quality public education every day, no matter what it takes. We work collaboratively with each other, with state policymakers, and our community members toward these shared priorities:

- Priority Funding: A long-term fiscal plan that ensures sustainable education funding for current and future generations.
- Early Childhood Education: Equitable access to fully funded, high-quality pre-school for all Alaska children to improve school readiness and future success.
- Safety and Mental Health: Safe and secure schools, safety and well-being of students in school and in their communities, and increased access to mental health services.
- Preparing, Attracting, and Retaining Qualified Educators: A comprehensive statewide plan and programs to prepare, attract, and retain quality educators.
- CTE: Expansion of Career and Technical Education opportunities critical to high academic standards and Alaska's economic growth and stability.
- School Facilities and Broadband: Reliable investment in school construction and major maintenance so all Alaska children have safe facilities in which to learn. Sufficient reliable broadband to provide equitable access to high quality teachers, diversified curriculum, online resources, and global opportunities.
