UA Budget Cuts

- House approved \$35 million unallocated reduction to university budget in FY 2017.
- Senate approved \$10 million unallocated reduction.
- Regents preparing reductions & reorganization plan at all campuses.



EED Budget Deletions

- Early childhood development grants to districts: \$2 million
- Parents as Teachers & Best Beginnings: \$926,000 (retained in Senate version of budget)
- Mentoring program: \$1.5 million
- ANSEP: \$1 million
- Library, Archives & Museum: \$2.7 million (including Broadband access grant)
- Other reductions in EED: \$2 million (approx.)
- Total reductions: House \$9.8 million

Senate: \$8.9 million



Bills in Play SB 79 Rehire Retired

- Re-opens rehire program for retired teachers & administrators
- Request for lower fiscal note pending
 - Status: Senate CRA Committee
 - HB 172 identical bill in House Education Committee

Bills in Play SB 89 Parental Rights



Sen. Mike Dunleavy, R-Wasilla

- Requires districts to allow students to withdraw from tests or classes, with parental permission
- Prohibits districts from allowing Planned
 Parenthood on campus
 - Status: Passed Senate, in House Education Committee (Hearing on Monday 8 a.m.)



Bills in Play SB 191 Penalties for Sex Ed

- Imposes civil fines or penalties for violations of restrictions in SB 89 (ban on sex education from abortion service providers). Teachers and board members included.
- Status: Senate Judiciary
 Committee

Bills in Play

HB 102 Psychiatric Treatment Funding



Rep. Wes Keller, R-Wasilla

- Requires districts to provide funding to residential centers for education of students under treatment
 - Status: House Finance Committee



Bills in Play SCR 1 Civics Education Task Force



Sen. Gary Stevens, R-Kodiak

- Creates 12-member task force to recommend civics education curriculum for K-12
 - Status: Passed Senate, in House Finance Committee



New Bills

HB 298 Layoffs of Tenured Teachers



Rep. Cathy Tilton, R-Wasilla

- Amends 14.20.177(a) to allow layoffs for any reason
- Deletes requirement of decreased enrollment or drop in basic need of 3 percent
 - Status: House Education
 Committee (Hearing
 Wednesday, March 23)
