Wrangell Public Schools Profile

The City & Borough of Wrangell, Alaska is a coastal island community in the heart of Southeast Alaska. The district is in the Tongass National Forest at the mouth of the Stikine River, an important salmon producing river and recreational draw. Wrangell's economy centers around commercial fishing, tourism, and the marine service industry. Wrangell

is close-knit community with a population of

approximately 2,000 people.

The community has two grocery stores, two hardware stores, a hospital and pharmacy, a wonderful indoor recreation center with a pool, and a fully stocked community library.

Wrangell Public Schools has three sites (Evergreen Elementary School, Stikine Middle School, and Wrangell High School) serving approximately 260 students. Many of the staff are long-term employees with minimal turnover. The community and district have low transiency rates. Visitors are welcomed into Wrangell's schools and volunteerism by families and community members is routine. A variety of extracurricular activities are offered to students

Transportation: It is 700 air miles southeast of Anchorage and 756 miles from Seattle. Wrangell Public Schools has daily jet service provided by Alaska Airlines and is also served by the Alaska Marine Highway System.

Wildlife: There is an abundance of wildlife in this temperate rainforest environment. A variety of excursions are available to get you up close to glaciers, black and brown bears, moose, eagles, sea lions, harbor seals, whales,

salmon, and halibut, to name a few. The Anan Bear and Wildlife Observatory is a favorite spot to view brown and black bears feasting on salmon. There are numerous trails and campsites for the outdoor enthusiast.



Attractions: History and cultural influences can be viewed at the Tlingit Chief Shakes Island and Tribal House Historic Monument and the Petroglyph Beach State Park. The James & Elsie Nolan Center includes a beautiful museum. Muskeg Meadows Golf Course is a USGA regulation course as well as a course for local disc golfers.
