# What is ElitnaurAK?

- A statewide academy focused on supporting efforts to grow a diverse, local teacher workforce in Alaska
- This academy will assist Alaska's students and families through covered tuition and fees as well as support for students while they work to earn a college education to become an Alaskan teacher

# Why is ElitnaurAK needed?

- Reduce teacher attrition
- Return students to their local communities to become educators
- Reduce Alaska's dependence on out-of-state hires

# Who is it for?


- High school students enrolled in a public school district in Alaska who want to pursue a teaching career






Attend AMCS/UAA first two years

- College-ready students will earn credits through UAA in a two-year program as part of the four-year UAF Bachelor of Arts Elementary Education degree
- AMCS, a school within Anchorage School District, will provide support and guidance to AMCS students
- The power of the place









# Attend UAF at UAA for remaining two years


- Remaining on the UAA campus, AMCS graduates will continue to complete required coursework for a UAF Bachelor of Arts Elementary Education degree
- Students may be employed as classroom paraprofessionals, earn a stipend, or receive grant money while completing requirements for UAF BA in elementary education degree
- Tuition costs for the UAF BA in elementary education may be paid through ElitnaurAK





Return to home district to teach

- Home districts may offer employment to UAF education graduates as a return on investment
- Mentoring support for teachers will continue through a cohort model in the early employment years and may include coaching, ECHO collaboration/support, and specific professional development





# How do I participate?



- Next steps for interested districts
  - Contact: Gene Stone at Kusilvak Career Academy – tuition costs will be charged to home districts – residential costs will be paid by the State
- Possibilities
  - Students spend one semester getting acclimated
  - Enroll in early King Tech High School (KTHS) early childhood course
  - For rural Alaskan students, Kusilvak and KTHS may consider accepting sophomores

# When will it start?

- Planning stages are underway for the ASD Residency program
  - Working with by Prepared to Teach at Bank Street College
  - Subcommittee work has begun
- Ready to accept first year students beginning next year (2022-23)
